BDASC State Advocacy Days February 27- February 28, 2024

BDASC will be holding it's 15th Annual Advocacy and State Legislative Days during March as part of the National Bleeding Disorder Awareness Month. BDASC, along with our national partners, will be hosting advocacy training sessions leading up to the event. This important advocacy event fosters educational awareness with state legislators on the effects living with bleeding disorders can have on families. Health care access continues to be a threat to accessing high cost medications. We need **YOU** to help us share the impact this may have on the quality of life for those with bleeding disorders. You will have the opportunity to have important discussions and to ask for support on key areas of concern for access to affordable treatment care. Since its inception, our State Capitol Advocacy Days have provided for over 500 individual meetings with the South Carolina House of Representatives and our State Senators from districts throughout the state. These meetings are of key importance in helping our elected officials understand our communities unique needs while asking for support of our state programs that provide a safety net to those in need.

Advocacy training is provided in partnership with our national organizations; The National Bleeding Disorders Foundation, Hemophilia Federation of America, PhRMA, and our stakeholders, and other local and national advocacy partners. For South Carolina to have the most impact, we need members from each Congressional District to register so we can meet with every Congressmember representing South Carolina. Last year, volunteer advocates met with legislators and staff to discuss federal funding for bleeding disorder programs and the Accumulator Adjustment Porgrams.
